With any luck you'll notice **Coosaw Creek Country Club** on your approach to **Charleston International Airport**, in the South Carolina Lowcountry. Then you can plot how to play this pleasantly challenging Arthur Hills design, just 8–10 minutes away by car. The course skillfully employs doglegs and greenside mounding; of particular note is the narrower-than-narrow par-3 sixth hole, where a ball needs laser-guided circuitry to find the green.
